For those who have suffered losses due to Hurricane Helene, I strongly encourage you to apply for assistance from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) if you qualify. FEMA provides crucial support for individuals and families affected by natural disasters.

To apply for FEMA assistance, please visit their official website: https://www.fema.gov/assistance/individual

Eligibility criteria for filing a FEMA claim typically include:

- You must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national, or qualified alien. FEMA must be able to verify your identity.
- 2. Your address at the time of the disaster and the address where you are now staying.
- 3. Your insurance, or other forms of disaster assistance received, cannot meet your disaster-caused needs.
- 4. Your necessary expenses and serious needs are a direct result of the declared disaster.
- 5. Your damaged property must be in a federally declared disaster area.

To file a claim:

- 1. Document the damage with photos and video if possible.
- 2. Make a list of damaged or lost items.
- 3. If you have insurance, file a claim with your insurance company first.
- 4. Apply online at DisasterAssistance.gov, through the FEMA mobile app, or by calling 1-800-621-3362.
